Dear friends in Christ,

This week, I will be away on my annual retreat. All priests are expected to spend 4-5 days each year on a retreat, finding renewal and refreshment while spending time with the Lord. I typically try to go on my retreat during Lent because the purpose of a retreat fits so well with this season. Fr. Tom Smith, OFM Conv. and Fr. Ken Gering, OFM Conv. will be covering Masses while I am away. I will return in time for all Masses next weekend.

We are blessed here in our parish to have an opportunity for all parishioners to attend a retreat this Lent. Modeled on the *Living with Christ* Parish Retreat that was held here for several years, the new **Lenten Retreat** will be held this year Thursday, March 11 through Saturday, March 13. We try to schedule the retreat so it can fit into many people's busy lives. Thursday and Friday evenings, the retreat is from 6:00-10:00 pm; Saturday morning, the retreat is from 8:00 am-noon. The retreat is open to all parishioners, whether you have attended a previous Parish Retreat or not. Our plan is that we will offer a different, unique retreat each year during the season of Lent. So this year's retreat – on the theme of **Baptism: Called by God, Equipped by Christ** – will be unique to this year. Next year during Lent, we will offer a similar retreat, but with a different theme. This plan differs somewhat from the former Parish Retreat, which was always on the same topic. With the revised format, everyone can attend the retreat each year. This retreat offers an opportunity to pray together as a community, share meals and fellowship, listen to talks on the spiritual life given by parishioners, and celebrate the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation. More information on the retreat can be found elsewhere in the bulletin or by calling the parish office. Registration for the retreat is due to the parish office by Friday, March 5.

This week, we begin our annual Lenten Soup and Soul Food Series. Please take note of two different components to our weekly Lenten program: there will be an additional **Lenten Evening Mass** every **Wednesday during Lent at 5:30 pm**. Following this Mass, there will be a **soup supper** served in Wagner Hall at 6:00 pm. Each Wednesday evening concludes with an **Adult Faith Formation talk** at 6:45 pm. **If you are planning on attending the soup suppers, please contact Lori Hamilton at the parish office; we are looking for people to provide soup for each week during Lent and are asking those who will be attending to sign up for one of the weeks.** Our parish Adult Faith Formation Team will be coordinating set-up, serving, and clean-up for each of the weekly soup suppers.

As we observe the Year for Priests, we have invited several priests who have been associated with the parish over the years to return for these Lenten Wednesday evenings to preside at Mass and speak at the Soup and Soul Food Session. This week, we welcome back **Fr. Jeff Godecker**. Fr. Jeff is a native son of OLPH and attended grade school here. In the forty years since he was ordained a priest, he has served at parishes in Indianapolis and Terre Haute, been a high school teacher and served as the director of religious education for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. He is currently serving in a ministry that he has been involved in for many years – college chaplain at Butler University in Indianapolis. He also serves as the chairman of the Priests Council of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Fr. Jeff recently returned from a trip to Israel and Jordan and will share some of his experiences from that trip in a talk entitled *Religious Identity: Reflections from Israel and America*. Please join Fr. Jeff this **Wednesday, February 24, beginning with Mass at 5:30 pm, a soup supper at 6:00 pm, and the talk at 6:45 pm.**

**Kroger/Scrip Program Agreement**

Our Lady of Perpetual Help sponsors a scrip program. This program allows you to purchase scrip (i.e. gift cards or certificates) that generate rebates from the participating retailers. OLPH requires written documentation from the scrip purchaser on how the rebates generated from the scrip program are to be distributed. Several options for the distribution are noted below, including tax deductible donation to OLPH and tuition support for a specified family which is non tax deductible.

In making your selection, OLPH asks that you keep in mind that this program is operated by volunteers for the primary purpose of raising funds to support the parish mission. Designating a significant portion of your rebate as a donation is essential to the program's success. While not required, we recommend that you elect to donate at least 50% of the rebates to the school. This allows us to continue to provide the program to benefit all parties involved. Your donation allows us to cover important educational expenses such as computers and support staff, as well as providing tuition assistance for school families.

Your donation may also be considered a tax-deductible charitable contribution subject to IRS rules and regulations governing such donations. For all donations received, annually OLPH will provide a contribution letter for use in your personal tax preparation.

The parties agree as follows:

- 1. OLPH operates this program on your behalf from such retailers and in such quantities as you designate from time to time.
- 2. OLPH will apply your rebates as you elect below (please check A, B, or C):
  - A. 100% OLPH Fund(Tax Deductible)
  - B. 50% OLPH Fund (Tax Deductible)/ 50% Tuition ( \_\_\_\_\_ **Family Name**).
  - C. \_\_\_\_\_ Custom Election (To ensure a successful program, we highly recommend that at least 50% be credited to OLPH as a tax deductible contribution).

    - \_\_\_\_\_ % Tuition (Not Tax Deductible) ( \_\_\_\_\_ Family Name).
    - \_\_\_\_\_ %Cash Back (Not Tax Deductible).

You agree and acknowledge as follows: (i) no legal employment or partnership arrangement is created as a result of the scrip relationship; (ii) you are the owner of the scrip purchased on your behalf; (iii) you have limited rights to return the scrip we purchase on your behalf, based on the return policy of our scrip supplier; (iv) you shall indemnify OLPH and its representatives against any loss incurred in connection with there being insufficient funds in your account to cover checks or ACH transfers you issue to pay for your scrip; and (v) OLPH or its representatives make no representations or warranties of any kind with respect to the scrip. This agreement is effective upon signing and shall continue indefinitely unless terminated by either party upon 60 day's advance written notice to the other party, or a new agreement is subsequently executed.
