Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend, we celebrate our patronal feast day – **The Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help**. I hope that many of you are planning on joining us this Sunday afternoon, June 27, at 1:00 pm in Wagner Hall for our annual Parish Picnic. This picnic is an opportunity for us to gather as a parish community to celebrate the many blessings God has shown to us and to enjoy the company of family and friends. Many thanks to **Beth Duffy-Dries** and **Shannon Rush** for coordinating this year's picnic.

This week also sees the end of the fiscal year, which runs from July 1 through June 30. Many of the leadership groups in our parish have terms that coincide with the fiscal year and so will be bidding farewell to some members this week while also welcoming new members. On our Pastoral Council, we bid farewell to **Carrie Everhart**, **Beth Duffy-Dries**, and **Mark Bliss** who have completed their terms of service. I offer my personal thanks to Carrie, Beth, and Mark for their years of service on this advisory and leadership council. We welcome three new members of the Pastoral Council as of July 1: **Sarah Hughes**, **Ryan Miller**, and **Danielle Miller**. I look forward to working with them in the coming years.

This week, I will be attending a two-day conference for priests in Louisville in preparation for the implementation of the **Third Edition of the Roman Missal**, the new translation of the Mass texts that will be coming most likely in November 2011. While this transition is still a long way off, there is much work to be done in preparation. This particular workshop is being presented by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Divine Worship and the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. They are hosting 20 of these workshops throughout the United States, and we are blessed to have one of them so close to home. The workshop is Tuesday afternoon and all day Wednesday at St. Margaret Mary Church in Louisville.

Because of the times of the workshop, please note that there are some changes in Mass times this week. **Tuesday, June 29, Mass will be at 8:00 am, and Wednesday, June 30, Mass will be at 5:30 pm.** These time changes will allow me to attend all of the workshop sessions in Louisville.

This week is also **Faith In Action**, an annual home mission camp sponsored by the New Albany Deanery Catholic Youth Ministry Office and based at Mount Saint Francis. I have been invited to celebrate their closing Mass this Thursday afternoon. It looks like it will be a busy week!

While the summer months are often a slower time than normal in the life of the parish, planning is in high-gear for all ministries and programs for the coming year. We are especially looking forward to the second year of the *One Church, One Faith* Total Parish Faith Formation Program, with its monthly highlight, **Week One**, scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month from September through May.

We are also seriously considering bringing back the **Main Event** this coming winter, the formal dinner and auction that served as our primary parish fundraiser for many years. It has been a couple of years since we have put on the Main Event, and in that time we have heard a from number of parishioners who would like to see it become an annual parish event once again. However, such an event takes a great deal of planning and volunteer work, and the only way we can bring back the Main Event is by having a dedicated group of parishioners committed to organizing it. There are some parishioners who have expressed interest in coordinating the event, but they need assistance. If you have any interest in helping to plan the Main Event for this winter, please contact me or the parish office as soon as possible.

Finally, I offer my personal thanks and gratitude for the many kind words, notes, cards, and gifts that I have received at the conclusion of the Year for Priests. I feel truly blessed to be able to minister in this parish community, and am grateful that God and the Archbishop have placed me here!

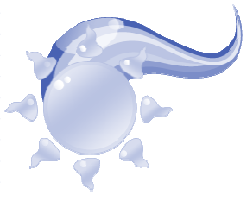

If you haven't registered for an upcoming OLPH Sports season, you can find **registration papers, Deanery Physical Forms & Medical Release Forms** in the Parish Office. *Sports Physicals expire one year after the date of issue.* Please call the parish office to determine if your child will need an updated physical. Registration forms and Medical Release Forms must be updated on an annual basis.

To register for OLPH athletics, you must be a registered OLPH parish member or registered at OLPH Catholic School and be in grades 3-8.

**Coaching applications, background check forms and information forms for virtue and coaches orientation** can also be found in the Parish Office.

Background checks *expire 5 years* after the date of issue, compliance with Virtus will not expire as long as the bulletins are read and completed online, & Coaching Applications must be submitted to the Athletic Commission for review on a sport to sport basis.
